

I rented this e-Textbook for a graduate-level course. This second edition has many errors -- not misspellings but sentences where words are missing or sentences that are in direct conflict with other sentences (very confusing). Many of the case examples presented seem to be incomplete (like they are missing the conclusion). There are several instances where references within the book are invalid. For example, in one of the later chapters in the book (maybe chapter 8?), there is a statement like "this topic will be further explained in Chapter 4" instead of "this topic was already explained in Chapter 4." There are also multiple instances where there is a reference to a figure that doesn't match what the text is saying. I hope the authors are working on a 3rd edition to make corrections and that they are using a better editor.

Reading this book I had a lot of fun! At the beginning of each chapter there is a case of a real life true example of what will be discussed throughout the rest of the chapter. Each chapter is organized

and easy to follow in more of a story plot way that a textbook way. There are lots of graphs which I found complemented the text very well. The whole book is like a history timeline of ERPs so it helped me understand why ERPs are the way they are and why/how they developed and evolved to where they are now. There are times when I felt that there was not enough detail, as if I was reading about information at too much of a high level, and other times I was glad this was not a technical book. This book would be great for providing basic historical information for those who may not be well versed in all the technical terms of the trade and want to know the affects ERPs have on and within a company.
