Keller and the various contributors assume readers have a solid foundation in philosophy rather than, say, environmental sciences. It is more geared toward philosophers looking to expand their knowledge about this dimension of ethics, and not so much toward environmental scientists and students looking to expand their understanding of the ethical dimensions of the field. I used this as a textbook in a course populated by non-philosophy majors, and it was a struggle. I am looking for a more appropriate text now.

It arrived a few days after I had hoped it would, but still in time. It's a fabulous book, combining esoteric philosophical underpinnings of ethics with justifications for and arguments against direct action, and addressing pragmatic consequences of ethical positions.
