

I gave this book four stars.

I love anthologies because I get to experience the work of several different writers. I came for Adichie's work, but I was especially touched by the stories of Jhumpa Lahiri, Shabnam Nadiya, Sequoia Nagamatsu, and Vanessa Gebbie. The writings made me want to learn more -- more about the authors, more about the culture. I guess that's the purpose. If so, it worked!

This is a read like no other. The stories are well written and filled with experiences so unlike my own that it felt as if I had to reach far beyond myself to be inside them. Yet each writer does, indeed, bring the reader to their world. The stories are often sad, heartbreaking at times, yet they conjure up worlds that seem everyday somehow. Not my everyday, but believable nonetheless.

I enjoyed reading these new authors. I find that the stories are stirring and help me understand what others' lives are like and I appreciate that

I gave it 3 stars because only half of the stories did I feel were written exceptionally well. The others didn't make sense or ended in a strange place. The Nigerian stories were my favourites and I'd recommend this book to someone interested in learning about other cultures.

I love the way it is easy for any reader to find and relate to the common themes of these very international compilation; I only wish some stories were a bit longer and perhaps would explore the themes and underlying themes a bit more in depth but overall great stories to pass the time away.
