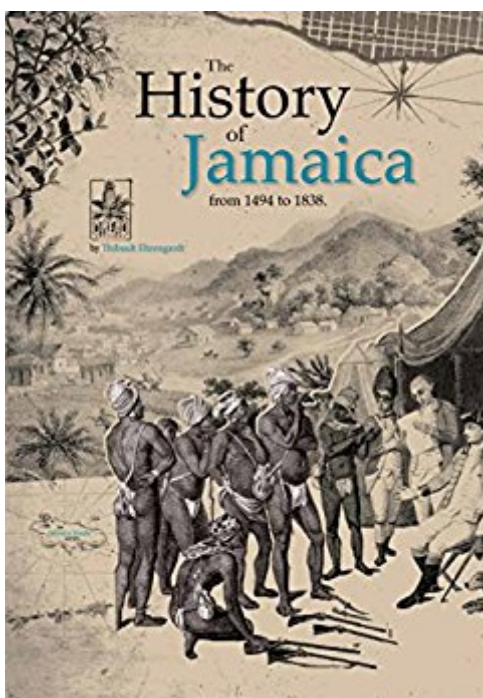

The style of writing takes some getting used and is not always chronological but the presentation is good and thorough.
