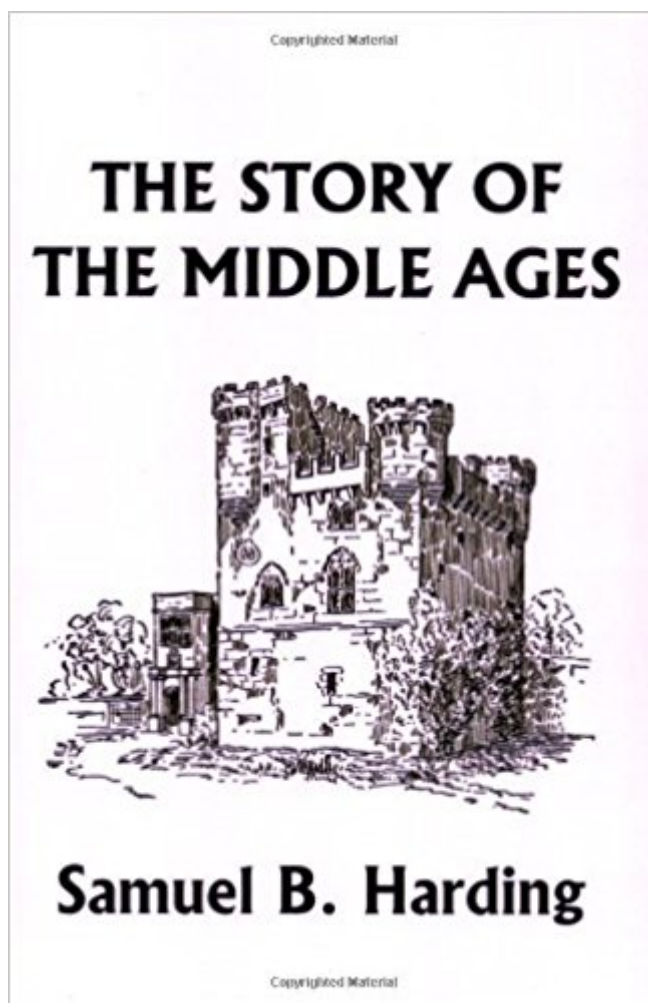

This is a very basic book for the understanding of the Middle ages. Its helps you visualize the moment and is narrated in an entertaining way.

A nice reproduction, and a comfortable read for the general audience down to middle school.

Using this book (Kindle version) for TOG YR 2, Unit 1. I am having a 5th grader read it alone, and he seems to be grasping the material. It is a little tricky because the page numbers don't match up with those listed in TOG's reading assignments, but if you go to the "Look Inside" copy of the book you can print the Table of Contents, so at least you can match the chapters with what is being discussed that week.

This book was written for a younger readers. Because of this, the author offered clear explanations on events and people. Harding, for example, clearly covered reasons for the start and the ending of the Middle Ages. Although I love Medieval history, and have read many related books, I learned from this book. I found myself saying, "Oh, so THAT'S why". Recommended to clarify in a "Middle Ages for Dummies" approach.

Does its job, which is providing very good information. Not exciting at all, which I know isn't always needed. But using it for a child to read as required literature is almost torture.
