

I loved the way that the book was written, but as a Virginian, I am concerned about a minor detail. The book leads readers to believe that Washington spent his early years living at Mount Vernon. That is not entirely right! He was born in Westmoreland County, VA, then spent a few years at Little Hunting Creek, which later became known as Mount Vernon. But for most of his younger life, he lived at Ferry Farm which is close to Fredericksburg, VA. During his teenage years he spent time with his brother Lawrence at Mount Vernon, then inherited the plantation after his brother's death.

DO NOT skip getting this in hard cover. The pages do not look like they will rip easily, great dust cover, awesome drawings and fantastic learning lesson. I cant wait to pick up the whole series for my boys. MUST HAVE. Great lessons and history
