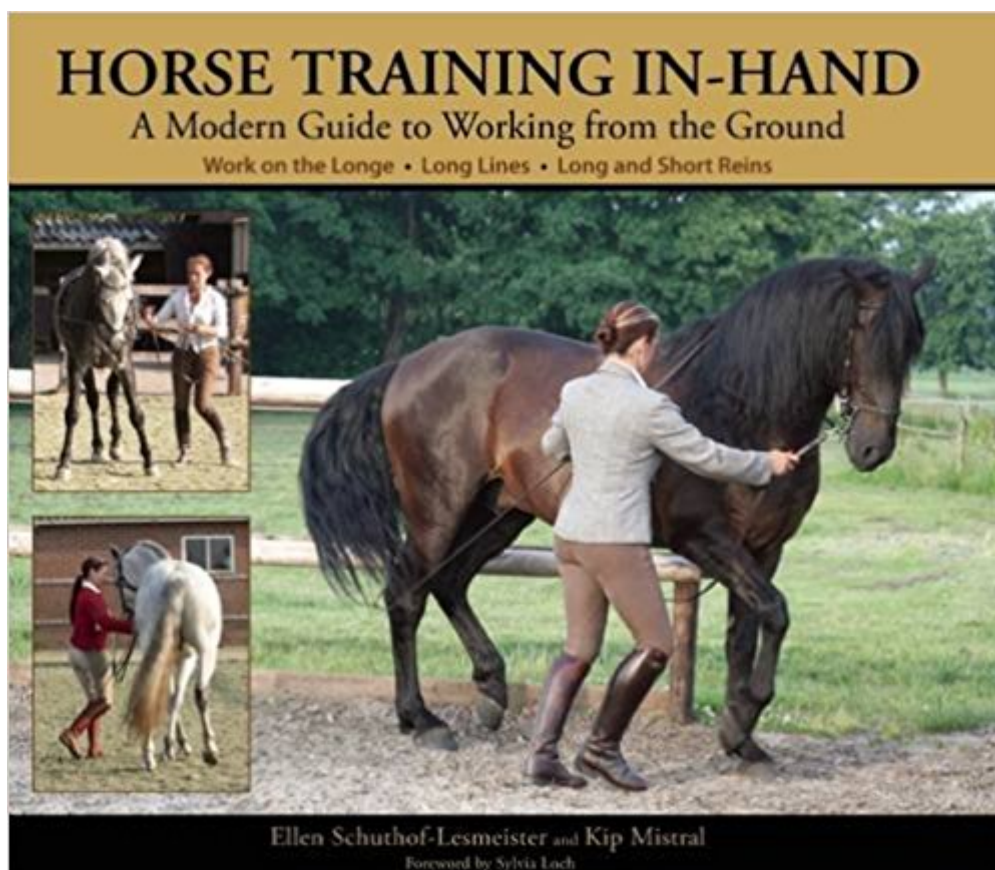

Of the 300 plus horse books in my collection, I rank *Horse Training In-Hand* in the top 15. While I admire Hinrichs' *Schooling Horses in Hand: A Means of Suppling and Collection* and Dietz's *Training the Horse in Hand: The Classical Iberian Principles*, I prefer this work by Schuthof-Lesmeister and Mistral because of its detailed step-by-step layout and the clarity of the instructions, something quite rare in dressage books. Accompanying the lesson plans are precise photographic and sketch illustrations with captions providing still more detail. While *Horse Training In-Hand* defines important terms, it is not for the total neophyte. However, for those who have a basic knowledge of classical dressage and those who can also judge how a horse moves, this book is a gem.
