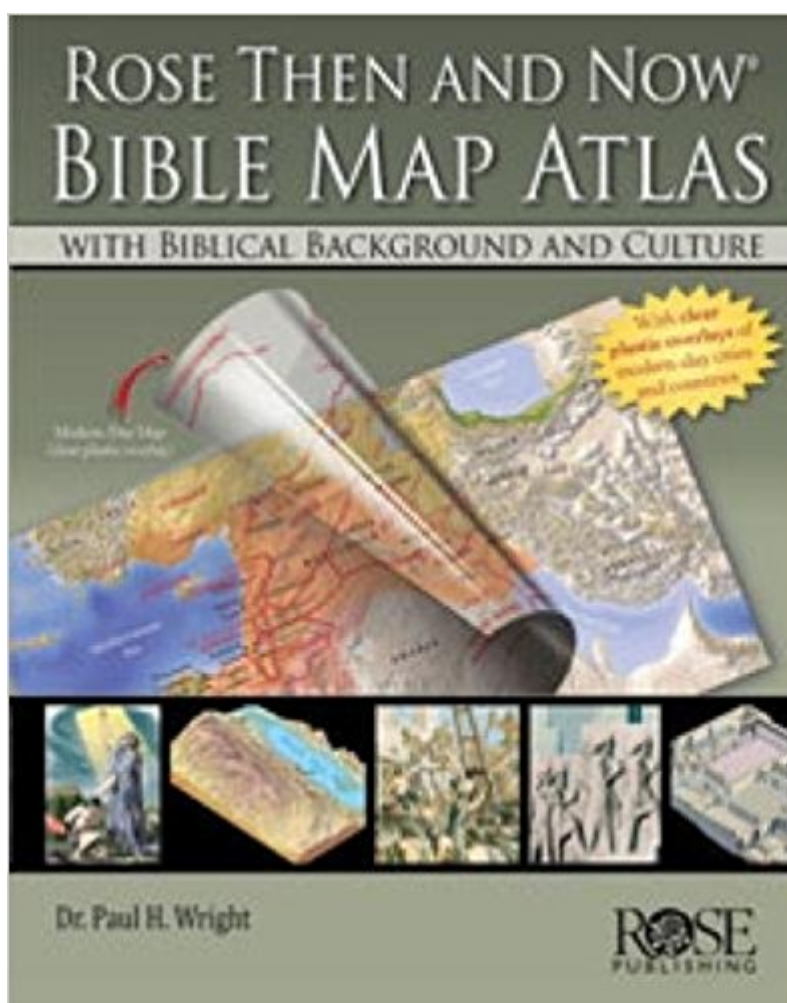

The Rose Then and Now Bible Map Atlas by Dr. Paul H. Wright is a tremendous new resource for students, pastors, and biblical scholars. As noted in the title, the atlas contains a well-known but under-appreciated feature, the integration of a clear modern-day overlay for the main maps. As many professors can attest, geography, even modern, is far from a strong suit of many students, and the integration of the ancient and modern map is definitely needed to help orient readers to where the biblical stories took place and how that connects with today's landscape. Beyond the expected features of any atlas clear, visually compelling maps, timelines, and site photos Wright's work displays a number of key strengths that flow from the unique combination of his educational background and his years of living in the land. First, the Atlas, shows a keen awareness of significant academic issues in the study of the land and brings those to light in a user-friendly way. The cautious comparisons of ancient pastoralists to traditional Bedouin is one prime example. Second, the work with its deep academic underpinnings in the modern study of history and culture, also displays a remarkably adept handling of the theological significance of the land in general and the setting of particular stories, as well as the literary use of geographical features in the various narratives of both the Old and New Testaments. Finally, it is clear from the photos, the comments on the sites, and the depth of knowledge that Wright's acquaintance with the land comes not just from decades of reading, but

from years of living, studying, and teaching in the land. The first hand experience is evident on virtually every page. This is a book that I would highly recommend for anyone looking for help understanding the role of the physical setting of the Bible, the cultural milieu across the centuries it covers, and the unique literary usage of place in the narratives of the both the Old and New Testament. Wright is to be commended for producing such a clear, nuanced, and accurate text, and Rose should be thanked for making it available to us in such an attractive and helpful format. --J. Dr. Wright holds the BA degree in anthropology from Bethel College (now Bethel University), an MA degree in the history of ancient Israel from the Institute of Holy Land Studies, an MA degree in Old Testament from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and the M Phil and PhD degrees in Bible and Ancient Near East from Hebrew Union College. He is also an ordained minister and has, over the years, been an effective teacher in both adult and children's church ministries. He and his wife Diane have lived in Jerusalem for fifteen years, and raised their two children there. They are active members of East Jerusalem Baptist Church, a small congregation that represents an active mix of dedicated people from all over the world who live and minister in Jerusalem and the surrounding

Okay, when this book arrived I nearly sent it back. Thought I'd ordered the wrong book as I expected lots of maps. Then I started reading and got totally hooked. Do NOT try to read the book. Treat it as reference or study material. It is excellent with lots of details and references to passages in the bible. So a page of reading will take you forever if you want to check every reference but it's worth the time and trouble. I'm studying the Old Testament from a historical rather than a religious point of view. Why did people go where they did; how did it develop from there; where did they go next and when - the list goes on and on. Dr. Wright starts the book with The Landed Context of the Biblical Story, covering Topography, Climate and Available resources - a real eye opener and a must for a serious student of the Old Testament. My only criticism is that I would've liked more maps with overlays of where those ancient towns are today. I realize that would've made the book too bulky and thus have ordered more maps. As it is I find myself continuously searching in another map where the town is I'm reading about. The chapter headings themselves challenge you to read : for example: Deborah and Jael - A Sweet Song of Victory; Samson - Greatness run Amuck; David and Solomon - Our Legacy; Rizpah - When Not-So-Little-things Really Matter..... And so much more. Obviously I did not return the book. And I highly recommend this for anyone that is curious about the Old Testament. However, I reiterate, it's work, not play.
