

This has been a great resource for my son, who is in TK (which is a 2 year kindergarten program they do here in CA). There are TONS of great resources within this book. It has a word, they trace it, write it, write it in a sentence, and re-write it on their own. Breaking it down in those simple steps has really helped my son and he is well on his way of knowing all his sight words. I have also laminated some pages that way he can get more practice out of them, you could easily put it in a clear page

protector as well. :) I'm hoping to get him ahead of the game, and this book is helping me AND him achieve that. This would also be a great teacher resource for worksheets for students.

Inexplicably, each sheet has an area for the student to cut out at the bottom. It may be one letter or more, but the cut out for one side of the sheet makes the reverse side (a different exercise) impossible to use.

I was originally excited about this book. I was, however, a little disappointed when I saw that the cutout pieces interfered with the next page. I am going to make copies of the pages and use them that way. I think this is a good tool, but needs a little work on the format.

These are worth every moment you spend with your child working together to learn how to read words on sight. My kindergartner now reads me at least 2 bedtime stories at night.

We are using this book to help my child prepare for Kindergarten. We use this book daily. Right now I'm just reading each word and having him say them. He's just now writing his alphabet so we will practice writing these sight words soon. Great book - worth every penny!

I bought this for my son to help him with his spelling. He really enjoys the pages and it doesn't feel as much like work to him. I noticed at school the teachers have the same pages:) makes me feel better about buying this for him. If you're going to do the cutting out part on the worksheets you definitely need to make copies of the pages since the words are back to back for the pages, wish the had spaced them apart incase you didn't need multiple copies.

My son gets lessons very similar to these from his kindergarten class and enjoys doing them, so I bought this book to supplement the work. The lessons themselves are great however unless you plan on photo copying the back side of each lesson then only one side of the lesson can be used for the cut out portion of the exercise. Each page consists of a cut out where words are cut out to paste on the work sheet, however the back page also has this and the cut out portion is in the same location. So on each double sided page, (unless you photocopy each back side) you have to choose which one to do because when you cut out the word for one page to glue on, you have cut the same section for the backside page. Basically if you do not want to tear out and copy one side of each work sheet you are only getting a half book!

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
