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Photographer's Guide To The Panasonic Lumix LX100





Synopsis

This book is the larger-sized paperback version of Photographer's Guide to the Panasonic Lumix LX100. This version of the book contains the same content as the earlier version, which was published in January 2015 with dimensions of 8.5 by 8.5 inches (216 by 216 mm). The new version of the book, which replaces the original version, is being published at a size of 8.5 by 11 inches (216 by 280 mm) in order to present more information on each page, which keeps related images closer to the text they illustrate and reduces the page count, making the book easier to manage. The book contains more than 350 color photographs showing the camera's controls, display screens, and menus. The guide also includes examples of images captured using the many creative settings of the camera, including the Photo Style settings; the Filter button picture effects, which provide the ability to customize the appearance of images in dramatic ways; and the camera's features for continuous shooting and shooting in high-contrast lighting conditions. The book also includes a full discussion of the video recording abilities of the LX100, which offers manual control of exposure and focus during movie recording, and which provides ultra-high definition 4K recording of motion pictures.

Mr. White has an uncanny ability to take information that is almost indecipherable in the manual and present it in a conversational, easy-to-understand manner. The book is well organized and thorough. I learned interesting and useful information on using the LX100 as a still camera even though I have 10 years experience as a still photographer, a few years with the LX7, and the benefit of Mr. White's book on the LX7. I have almost no experience shooting video. So, as an experiment, I reviewed the video portions of this book. I found them informative and easy to understand as well.In short, if you are going to spend \$800-900 for the camera, spending \$10-25 on this helpful book is a no-brainer.

The book is very well organized and quite informative. The Kindle edition is fine in black and white on my Paperwhite. However, the color photo examples are more informative using the Kindle reader on a PC.As some reviews have suggested, the book may be too basic for a photography enthusiast or professional. However, it was just right for my level of expertise. Mr. White goes over each LX100 menu item and physical control, explains how it should be used, provides numerous examples, and suggests menu and physical control default settings.Overall, I'm very satisfied with the book and am confident that it will improve my LX100 photos and videos.

Great book for a great camera. First, this is a really nifty camera. I also have a Nikon D7100 with a large zoom lens. But, I'm finding this Lumix L100 to be my "go to" camera. The book explains everything I would want to know and suggests several beneficial settings. The camera itself is simple to use and perhaps I could have figured out most of the book on my own. But, the camera is so good that I would not want to waste time on my own. After the investment in the camera, the book is a minor amount to pay to get maximum enjoyment from the camera. I found the book to be quite easy to follow and to have appropriate accompanying photos.

The LX100 is my first professional camera. I've taken a lot of photos in the past, and used consumer film cameras before going exclusively to using my iPhone for photos. While I was immediately able to take great photos with my LX100 using iA mode, anything outside of full auto mode was unusable to me. I've been reading this book for a few minutes a day and slowly incorporating what I've learned, and there is no way I could have figured this out on my own.I'm not even halfway through the book and I'm already using the camera settings quickly and efficiently to get great pictures with

less frustration. The book is not only easy to read but doesn't shy away from going deep into the controls. The author has done a great job and has earned a good review from me.
