

This book is decent, but there are books that are much better at teaching and dealing with coding from the CPT and ICD 10 as far as basics go. There is even a few areas where the suggested answer for the instructor was wrong. Also, it is NOT ideal to start off with ICD 10 and then throw someone under the bus with ICD 9 info. THis causes a great deal of confusion for new coders.

I would give it 5 stars, but am upset that all of Chapter 11 is missing without warning! Plus, the
