Synopsis

The deluxe eBook edition of *Never Broken* includes more than an hour of audio tracks and video footage, including live performances, exclusive a cappella recordings of each song featured in the book, and a rare recording of the audition that Jewel made at age fifteen for Interlochen Arts Academy. These additions, along with photographs of handwritten lyrics, personal artwork from Jewel's archives, behind-the-scenes tour footage, and more, enrich the heartfelt emotion and sense of adventure already so present in Jewel's words.

New York Times' best-selling poet and multi-platinum singer-songwriter Jewel explores her unconventional upbringing and extraordinary life in an inspirational memoir that covers her childhood to fame, marriage, and motherhood. When Jewel's first album, *Pieces of You*, topped the charts in 1995, her emotional voice and vulnerable performance were groundbreaking. Drawing comparisons to Joan Baez and Joni Mitchell, a singer-songwriter of her kind had not emerged in decades. Now, with more than thirty million albums sold worldwide, Jewel tells the story of her life, and the lessons learned from her experience and her music.

Living on a homestead in Alaska, Jewel learned to yodel at age five, and joined her parents' entertainment act, working in hotels, honky-tonks, and biker bars. Behind a strong-willed family life with an emphasis on music and artistic talent, however, there was also instability, abuse, and trauma. At age fifteen, she moved out and tasked herself with a mission: to see if she could avoid being the kind of statistic that her past indicated for her future. Soon after, she was accepted to the prestigious Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan, and there she began writing her own songs as a means of expressing herself and documenting her journey to find happiness. Jewel was eighteen and homeless in San Diego when a radio DJ aired a bootleg version of one of her songs and it was requested into the top-ten countdown, something unheard-of for an unsigned artist. By the time she was twenty-one, her debut had gone multiplatinum.

There is much more to Jewel's story, though, one complicated by family legacies, by crippling fear and insecurity, and by the extraordinary circumstances in which she managed to flourish and find happiness despite these obstacles. Along her road of self-discovery, learning to redirect her fate, Jewel has become an iconic singer and songwriter. In *Never Broken* she reflects on how she survived, and how writing songs, poetry, and prose has saved her life many times over. She writes lyrically about the natural wonders of Alaska, about pain and loss, about the healing power of motherhood, and about discovering her own identity years after the entire world had discovered the beauty of her songs.

A fast read that you cannot put down. Jewel reveals more in this book about herself that no other person would dare reveal about themselves. She shares her experiences of being bullied, being physically and verbally abused and neglected as a child, and being surrounded by perverts at a young age, as well as her positive experiences of being treated for free by a physician, being divinely protected throughout Mexico and while homeless, being protected by bikers and Inuit, and obviously being given a HUGE break. She spins her book into a self-help reference throughout and especially toward the end, showing how she overcame her past and showing us how we all can too! I like everything about the book, from the dedication, story, the poetry and pictures of her younger years and family. I found it quite touching. She writes in a way that makes the reader feel like they are almost there, in Alaska.

Let me start off by saying this review is probably incredibly biased: Jewel is my idol. Her life story is inspiring. Jewel's autobiography doubles both as self-help manual at times. The frankness of her narrative is no surprise to those of us who have grown up listening to her music or who hold it close to heart. Her words have seen me through some of the lowest times of my life, and she has been an every day angel for me when I needed it most. Jewel has taught me so much about myself, and I hope she goes to bed at night knowing how special she is in this world. She holds little back as she unleashes her narrative, yet holds a distinctly forgiving attitude towards the world despite her childhood traumas. She is a woman who has faced hardships and learned to love others through them, but most important she has learned to love herself.

I dog-eared nearly every page! This book is bursting with enlightened, heartfelt wisdom told through her beautiful, true stories. The poetry woven throughout is icing on the cake. Truly from Jewel's heart, this book is right up there with the likes of Elizabeth Gilbert and Brene Brown. I wish I could give it 10 stars! It is a must own for any person on a journey to find their true selves and purpose here.
