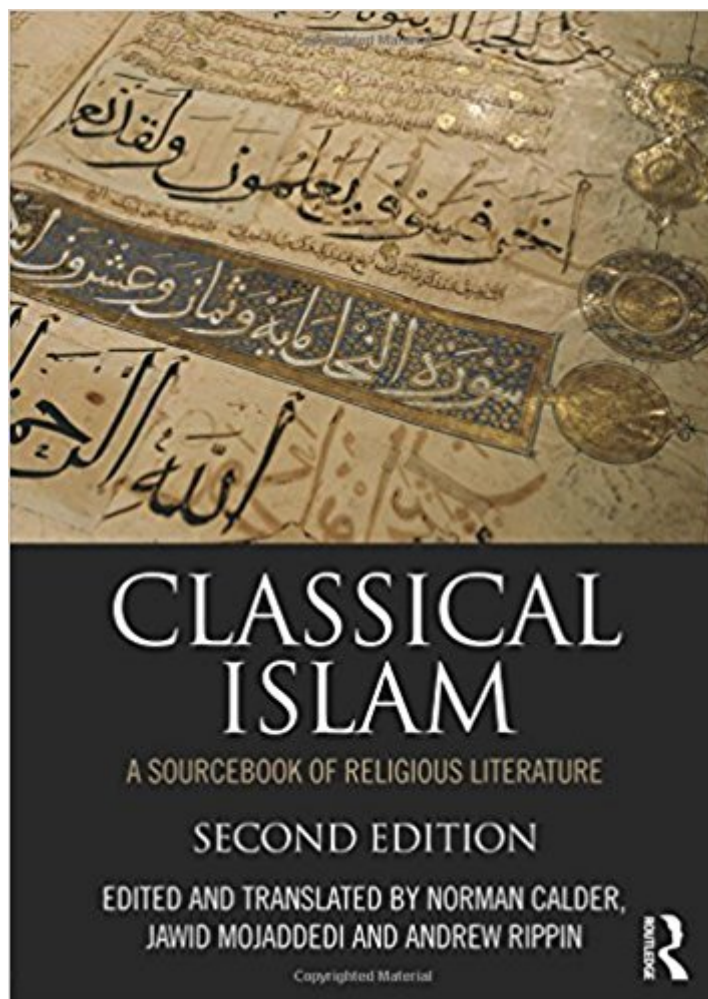

Norman Calder, who died in 1998, was Senior Lecturer in Arabic at the University of Manchester, UK. His Studies in Early Muslim Jurisprudence and numerous articles have had a lasting impact on the study of Islamic law. Jawid Mojaddedi is Associate Professor of Religion at Rutgers University, USA. This book contains selections from important sources of Islamic literature. There are selections from the Qur'an, the Life of Muhammad, the Hadith, and religious history. In addition there are sections on Qur'anic interpretation, theology and philosophy, law and ritual, and Sufism. My only criticism is that there are too many selections concerning zakat, the alms tax, one of the five pillars of Islam. In addition an excellent combination glossary/index is included.
