

Besides the subject matter an interesting aspect is the thought given to cross examination. That is a pillar of litigation and the British system has refinements, as pointed out, which are incredibly useful. I am a trial lawyer, so I have an idea of court room demeanor.

I was familiar with the legal cases that were at the heart of this book and the related film, and having taught and written about law and literature, and the role of story in explaining legal issues, whether in text or film or other media, I was anxious to see this film, and ordered this book on which it was based for my kindle to read before the film came to our theater. I would have liked to see more detail on the legal issues that were used to undermine the holocaust denier in the film, but obviously this book could cover more ground and the film was more focused. I recommend reading the book and then seeing the film, or renting it. It is something appropriate for library or community or religious group presentations/discussions. It feeds into the broader issue of 'alt-reality' whether in climate change denial, or misrepresentation of any political/economic/factual dispute in current public discourse. I would have liked to have seen a little more context in this book and the film based on it to show how the issues it raises are pervasive in our society in many ways today. Read it and weep.
