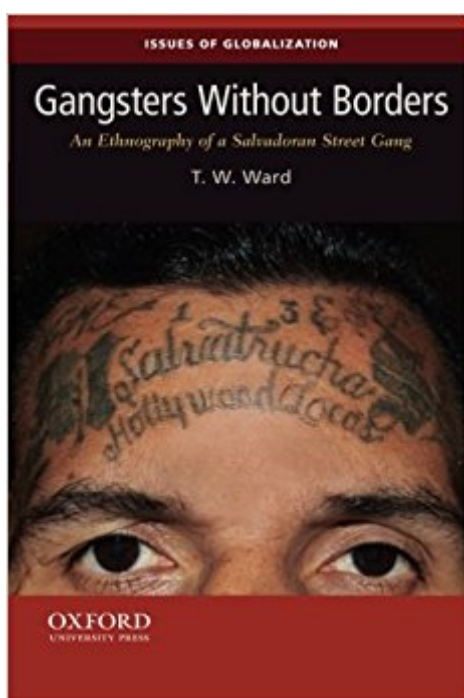


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Gangsters Without Borders: An Ethnography Of A Salvadoran Street Gang (Issues Of Globalization:Case Studies In Contemporary Anthropology)
