Homes offer a sense of identity, particularly for those in their formative years. Sarah CarrollÃf¢Ã ⠬à â,,¢s The Girl In Between depicts life on the street and on the move for a young girl and her mother from the eyes of the young girl.Within the walls of her Castle, a young girl can dream of the fairy tale life she wants instead of the harsh reality of homelessness she faces every day. While she has free reign over the Castle, she must be vigilant to remain invisible from the outside world or risk being taken away from her mother by the Authorities. With Authority representatives in yellow vests coming around her Castle to evaluate it, the girl fears that her home may be taken away from her or she from it, which would greatly change her life. In learning about the CastleÃf¢Ã ⠬à â,,¢s history as a mill from a fellow squatter, called the Caretaker, who is struggling against his past and grief to leave the mill after forty-seven years, the girl realizes that her mother also needs to face whatÃf¢Ã ⠬à â,,¢s haunting her in order to keep moving forward.A quick read that presents the realities of the world through the lens of a young girl offering a new perspective from which to consider the unfortunate issue of homelessness that plagues society. While the perspective of and experience with homelessness from the vantage point of young girl was quite intriguing and interesting as it was written in a manner that was captivating and using language that befits the narrator, the narrative was ultimately rather confusing, perhaps because it lacked an appreciable plot. The main character, the girl mentioned in the title, drew me in from the start. She had an innocence about her, a precociousness that comes with childhood, but also an underlying sense of understanding and that innate self-preservation that comes with a difficult life. Highly recommend. While this book is categorized as young adult/teen, I think it will appeal more strongly to the younger readers of this age range.

This book made me feel sad. Sad because the child, whose name we never know, lives in an abandoned building and thinks it is the best place she has ever lived, not counting Gran's house. Sad because her mother is a drunk and a drug addict who keeps her "safe" by taking her to drug dens and other abandoned buildings. Sad because she lives in hiding on the streets when her mother could have left her with her grandmother. But it isn't a sad book. The girl has a vivid imagination. The mill, which is falling apart, is a castle, complete with ghost. She people watches, and makes up stories about the people she see regularly. She loves her mother and knows her mother mostly loves her. But her mother made some bad choices, and those made for a sad ending.

Well written story that keeps you engaged. A poignant portrayal of the life of a homeless child (and mother.) But wow, talk about a surprise ending. I felt duped. This might actually work better as a short story, but after reading this novel (although rather short), I felt deceived. This ending didn't work for me at all after listening to this girl telling her own story through the entire book and then to have it end this way.
