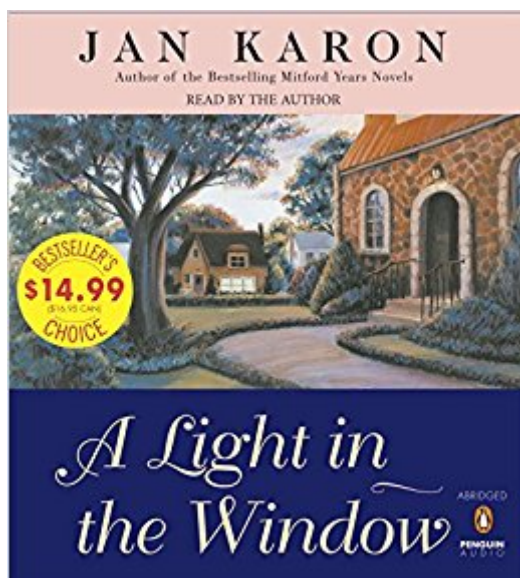

A Light in the Window is the second installment in this enormously popular series about a small-town rector, Father Tim, and the heartwarming cast of characters surrounding him. This time Father Tim, a lifelong bachelor, finds his heart distracted by his free-spirited neighbor Cynthia, but his stomach and the rectory cash box are distracted by Edith, a wealthy widow who is wooing the rector with love potion casseroles. At every turn, including when a brooding Irish cousin decides to move in, Father Tim must decide whether he will practice what he preaches. Fans of the series say they long to buy real estate in Mitford, just so they can live next door to these funny and endearing characters and feel the embrace of such a loving community. But what author Jan Karon probably knows, and many readers are starting to figure out, is that the integrity and solid Christian values

The second book of the Mitford series doesn't disappoint. Instead, we get to further become a part of this wonderful town and the beautifully crafted characters created by Jan Karon. I highly recommend it.

Jan Karon somehow manages to take readers into a different world, a gracious world of charm and great beauty. Mitford is a wonderful town, in a gorgeous location. The seasons, the foods, the flowers and the weather are almost like characters in themselves. This is not a book about physically perfect people, but real people with weaknesses and strengths who are willing to engage in and better each others lives. To some, the town may be idealistic, but there is actually significant complexity when it combines to the emotions of uncertainty and excitement that often come with romantic love.

Helen and her teacher, Anne Sullivan, must have both been blessed by God with incredible intelligence. Ms. Sullivan, without any formal teaching training, found ways to teach Helen that were unknown before that time. Helen's grasp of intangible concepts leave me shaking my head in awe. The book combines third party accounts, along with Ms. Sullivan's reports, her personal letters, Helen's autobiography, and her letters, in a way that takes the reader through all the phases of Helen's lifelong learning experience. I have shared stories from this book with friends in casual conversation more than any other book I have read in recent years, because the tale is just so extraordinary. I highly recommend "The Story of My Life" for anyone who has a fascination with learning.
