

The subject matter of these maps and the depth and detail allocated to the accompanying written narrative is captivating, exciting and enlightening. Who ever knew that there were maps of Edinburgh that looked at the city and its going ons in the manner so many of these maps do. 'The Arrival of the Railways', 'Mapping the Speed of Sound for the Time Gun' (the One O'clock Gun in the castle), 'The Caldonia's Tunnel Along Princes Street', 'Tuberculosis as a Window on Late Victorian Edinburgh Society'... See what I mean? Diversity. Yet through it all the the focus is on central Edinburgh (that's all there was, really) with much of it on the actual city centre and also Leith. Edinburgh: Mapping the City is a fantastic compendium of maps, diagrams, details and text that will enthral anyone with a love for that wonderful city. Very highly recommended.
