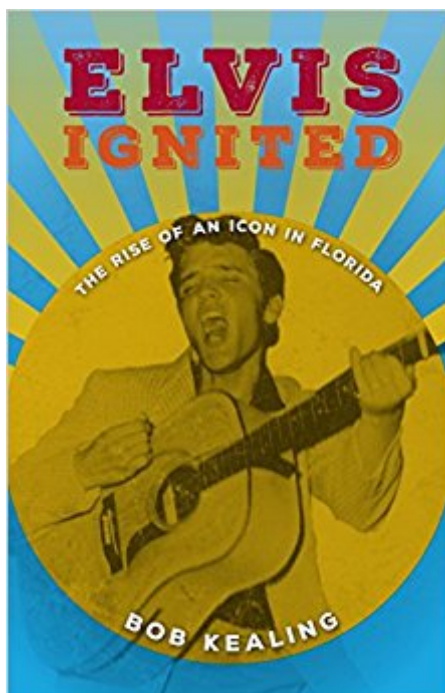

Elvis Ignited follows the immensely talented performer through his four tumultuous Florida tours in fifteen months spanning 1955-1956. In 1956, his most crucial and transformative year, Presley played more live shows in Florida than in any other state in the country becoming the object of worship, scorn, and controversy. Kealing spotlights intriguing back stories of Floridians like Presley's controversial manager Tom Parker and Mae Axton, who penned The King's first national breakout hit. Kealing follows the back roads travelled by Presley, Scotty Moore and Bill Black, interviews people who saw them up close recalling the time-stands-still memories of hearing Presley's hit songs for the first time and the shrieks of young fans at the sight of the young rockabilly god. Kealing reveals little-known historic sites in Florida tied to Presley's rise. Struck by a new kind of music and performances so different from anything they had known before, Floridians saw how special Elvis was before the rest of the world caught on. Kealing continues the story through Elvis's years in the army and the filming of Follow that Dream in Florida in 1961. Elvis's rise to fame in the Sunshine State was a turning point in

American music history. It was the arrival of rock and roll.

Elvis Presley's story has more moving parts than a Saturn V. How did a poor kid raised in one of the poorest neighborhoods in the poorest states grow up to become the most recognized person on earth? Presley's life has been analyzed and his story told and re-told, but until Bob Kealing dug in, there was hardly a word about the time and place where he served his musical apprenticeship: Florida. As a native Floridian and Elvis fan, this book is indispensable. Kealing's passion for celebrating Florida's history and its people, whether it's Tupperware or Brownie Wise or local legends like Jim Morrison and Gram Parsons, led him to unlock old memories and take readers step by step through Elvis' slow, steady, and then meteoric rise -- much of which was honed in the Sunshine State. What tickles me is hearing from people who grew up in a world known

as Old Florida dialing back to 1955 to share vivid memories about the time the Hillbilly Cat came to town. They fall back in time and to describe their teenage enthusiasm, their accessibility to the rising star, and you clearly recognize they knew they were tuning into something very, very different. These fortunate Floridians were present at the creation. And Kealing graciously gives credit where credit is due, namely to the female reporters from several Florida newspapers who, unlike their male counterparts, treated Presley with respect as a singer, performer and, to be sure, a Southern gentleman. It was their collective and shared perspective of the young singer that helped tell the story of the regional act that became a global phenomenon. Their stories enhance *Elvis Ignited* and make this an essential book that helps complete the Presley timeline. PS: Extra credit for referring to Dutch conman Andreas Cornelis van Kuijk as 'Tom Parker'. He was no friend of Elvis's, and certainly no colonel.
