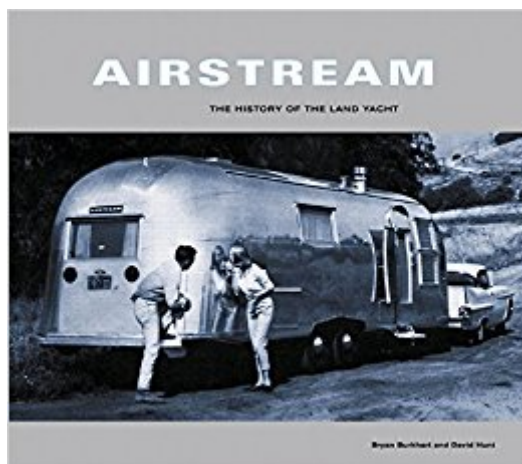

A wonderful collection of Airstream's nostalgic advertisements, travel pictures from the 50s and 60s, and explains the history of the Airstream company. The vintage cars shown are just as interesting as the trailers. I'm shopping for an older Airstream to do a renovation on and this book gave me enough background to know what I'd be getting into for each decade of production. This book helps us today to visualize how to use Airstream's products to our best advantage.

This fascinating history of the Airstream was of special interest to me. My parents bought a used Airstream in the mid-seventies and had several happy years of travel. Of course when we met them at a state or national park, we enjoyed good times and good food both inside of and outside of their Airstream. All that was missing in this chronicle were more inside photos, instead of the two photos and several drawings of happy folks cooking, eating, playing cards, and visiting in the Airstream. However, the book is still a wonderful history and contains excellent outdoor photographs from many countries. Who knew that the pygmies of Uganda were able to see a real Airstream? Who knew that the Airstream caravans reached as far as Russia and as India? The fellowship of the Airstream crowd comes through in a joyful way; an adventurous life for friendly people.

A very well done photo essay on the evolution of the Airstream and Wally Byam's camping philosophy. A must have if you have an Airstream, and a must have if you're looking for one. Either way this book was well thought out, executed and filled with wonderful photos. A trip back in time, recommend!

This book contains an interesting and plentiful assortment of photos and illustrations, but it is a drag to read. It is verbose and frequently veers off course to matters only loosely connected to Airstream's history. And the storyline jumps around and virtually disappears, time after time, into thickets of fluff. Overall I found it took unusual effort to find the wheat amidst the chaff in this book, and to follow the often sketchy, weaving trail of the story. Were I not so interested in Airstreams, I would not have finished it. I recommend it only to those likewise enamored.

Pictures are very interesting, as well as history, very in-depth. Second portion a bit heavy on the

international trips. Would have liked a linear history of makes and models along with floor plans, as we have a 1987 Excella, which was never mentioned, nor was anything post-1960's.
