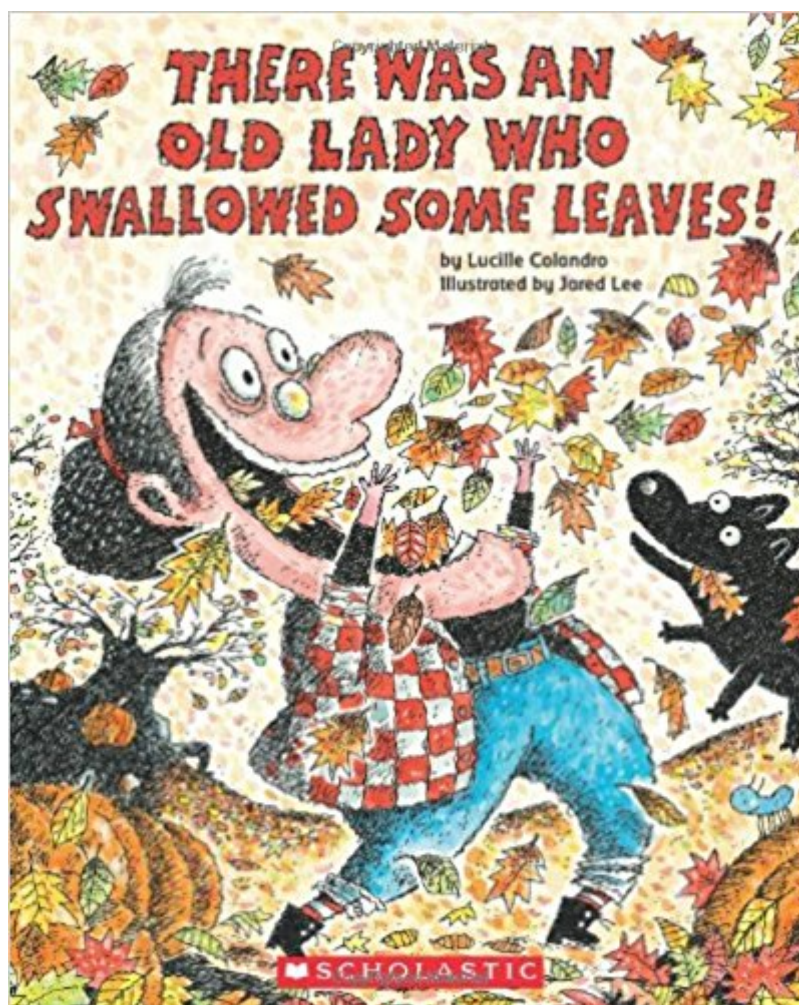

Was much better than the version I grew up with of "There was an old lady who swallowed a fly, perhaps she'll die". Terrible thought! I love this clever and fun filled way of showing sequence.
