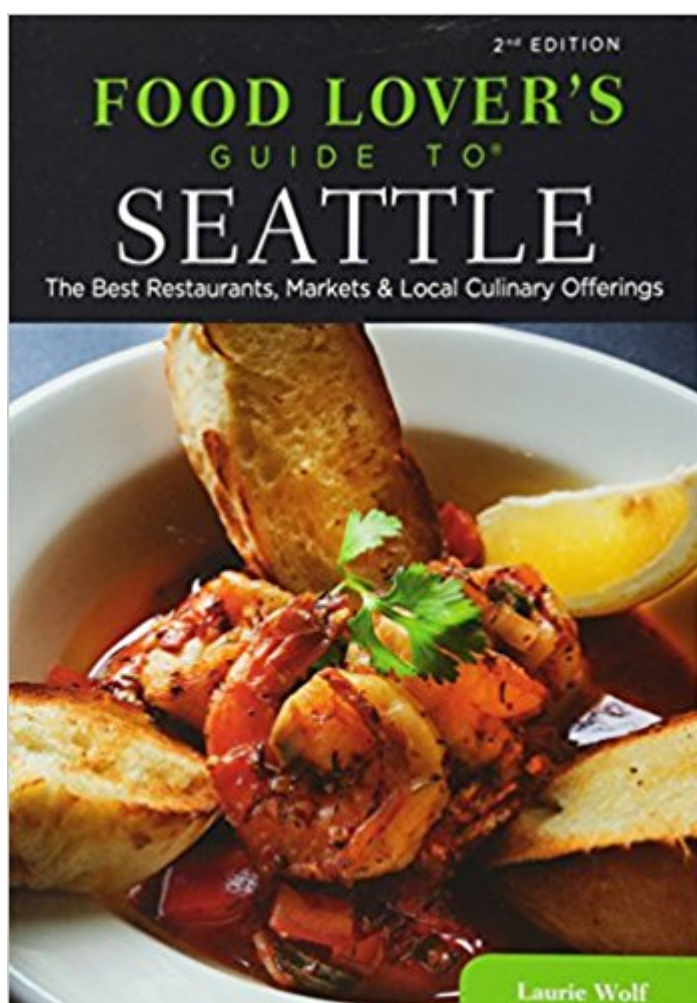

That was when we tossed the book and took other measures for finding places to eat. My suggestions are this...before going on vacation, peruse Tripadvisor and Yelp.
